



As the Holiday Season of Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Years draws near, the Museum is wrapping up a very successful and monumental year. Big thanks to the Minter Field District Board and their staff. Their support and cooperation has directly aided many of our year accomplishments. We are looking forward to this special relationship in 2009.

The beginning of our vision creating Minter Field circa 1942 has begun with the acquisition and return of an original Quonset hut to Minter Field. This was a result of our partnership with Valley Oaks Charter School of Bakersfield and a special donation by one of our Museum members Ken Fears. We have completed a 5 week enrichment course in Aviation at the school with the course conclusion of the students having a field trip to the FAA at Meadows Field. We will continue to develop programs in 2009.

Marketing, marketing and more marketing became the byline of 2008. In Feb we had an outstanding Founders Day Banquet followed in April by our Air Show with the largest attendance at any of our one day air shows, 5000 plus. Our Shafter outreach included the Shafter Chamber of Commerce holding one of their meetings at the Museum, participating in a joint Saturday visitation event with The Green Hotel and the Shafter Railroad Museum and a radio broadcast by on KERN hosted by Globe Travel from the Museum. Our display at the Kern County Fair was awarded a third place ribbon.

However, November made Minter Field Air Museum marketing history. We had special events taking place every Saturday in November. They were CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates for youth) program "Jump Back in Time", support of "The Gleaners" Bob Hope/ USO theme fund raiser to support food for those in need, Vets for Vets, joint showing at a Bakersfield Football game which featured our vehicles with the Corvette Club, and finally our first Military Swap Meet and Shoot.

In addition, we participated in the Shafter Cinco De Mayo Parade and the Bakersfield Veteran's Day Parade receiving a first place award for military displays and vehicles. The display was assisted by the Olive Drab Drivers, one of our special partners which include several of our Museum members and their vehicles...

What a month thanks to our members, partners and commercial support.

Two outstanding and special acquisitions were the Fokker DR1 Tri-Wing German WWI aircraft donated by Fred Slikker of Hemet and the Shafter Number 1 Volunteer Fire Engine. 

inventory control, mailing and even bank de-


posits. But we need someone to step up and volunteer for the job. If you have the time and the willingness to do something really worthwhile, please call or stop by the Museum and let us know.
