#### Founder's Day Banquet February 22nd, 2014

The Minter Field Air Museum will hold its Annual Founder's Day Banquet on Saturday, February 22nd, at Hodel's Country Dining located at Highway 99 and Olive Drive, in Bakersfield.

Social hour begins at 6:00 p.m., with dinner at 7:00 p.m., followed by our program.

Minter Field was officially dedicated on Saturday, February 7th, 1942. This banquet commemorates that official act.

Special guests will include Pearl Judd, a WASP (Women Airforce Service Pilot) assigned to Minter Field during World War II and Elinor Otto, an original "Rosie The Riveter" still working for Boeing, at 94 years young!



The guest speaker is tentatively scheduled to be Major General Arnold W. Bunch Jr., the Commander, Air Force Test Center, headquartered at Edwards Air Force Base, California. He directs a \$31 billion enterprise of more than 18,000 military, civilian and

contractor personnel across Edwards AFB, Eglin AFB and Arnold AFB.

During 2013 we hosted many special events and weekday tours. These events were a success thanks to all our volunteers.

In April 2013 the museum invited Peter Merlin to present a program on Area 51 and the SR-71. The attendance was much more than we expected, but as always our volunteers were up to the task.

On Mother's Day weekend the Airport District held a two day air show ("Madness Over Minter Field"). Our volunteers manned a booth on the flight line and sold souvenirs, MFAM shirts and raffle tickets for a limited edition military style bicycle. The Museum was open both days of the air show. Saturday we were packed with visitors all day and Sunday about half as many visitors. I want to thank all the volunteers that helped Saturday and Sunday, especially since they sacrificed Mother's Day to help the museum.

Saturday, May 25th, Memorial Day weekend was spent at the Kern County Raceway Park. The museum displayed Dave Patterson's Weasel and Bill Tracy's Jeep. Scott Hogstad brought the Staff Car and I brought the Yellow Jeep. Al Goines and Jim Whitehead also volunteered for the day. We were asked to come back for the Fourth of July and Labor Day weekend races. Nam POW and MIA display. Scott Hogstad has added more to his World War l display.

Cody Bowling worked hard on the 9-11 memorial event. We had over 300 motorcycles in attendance. Also on hand was San Joaquin Wellness clinic to check blood pressures, and the Kern County Fire Dept Helicopter was on display. Over 800 people attended. The hit of the day was the HUGE American flag flown from the top of the hook and ladder fire truck. Speakers included Mike Maggard (Chairman of the Kern County Board of Supervisors), General James Whitehead, and veterans from Iraq and Afghanistan.

On October 5th we had a James Dean 50's Dance to commemorate the races in 1955 that James Dean competed in. I want to thank Daryl Curtis for all his research and contacts with the James Dean Museum, in Fairmount, Indiana, for enabling Daryl to fill the hanger walls with Dean's racing memorabilia. Also, special thanks to the Golden Empire Region Porsche Club. They had 12 cars on display throughout the day.

On November 2nd the Minter Field Air Museum and Minter Field Airport District sponsored a fly- in, complete with a pancake breakfast and at least 50 airplanes. We honored two special guests - Pearl Judd, a WW ll Women Air Service Pilot (WASP) and Elinor Otto, a WW ll "Rosie the Riveter." The fly- in was a huge success!

In 2014 we are starting out with a bang! The first event of the year is the Frontier High School Winter Formal ("Come Fly with Me") on January 25th, with 1200 attendees expected.

# 2013 Year-In-Review

**Area 51 Exposed (April 20th, 2013)** - Peter Merlin, a well-known historian and author on\_the subject of Area 51 and the top secret testing of planes such as the SR-71, the U-2, and the F-117 Stealth Fighter, gave a presentation on Area 51 in the museum's hangar.

**Madness Over Minter Field (May 11th-12th, 2013)** - The Minter Field Airport District put on an airshow in May. The museum was on hand to support the MFAD and to give tours in the museum. It turned out to be one of the busiest weekends for the museum, with over 200 visitors.

**Kern County Raceway Park (Memorial Day, July 4th, and Labor Day Weekends)** - The museum has had the honor of participating in the pre-race activities at Kern County Raceway Park, Kern County's premiere NASCAR sanctioned half mile raceway. The museum has been invited to participate in 2014.

**7th Annual "Support Our Troops" Memorial Run (September 11th, 2013)** - The museum, once again, was host to the 9-11 memorial put on by Harley Davidson of Bakersfield. It was quite spectacular to see over 300 motorcycles converging on Minter Field for such an important event.

**"James Dean Was Here" Fund raiser (October 5th, 2013)** - The museum held its first ever event to commemorate James Dean and the races that he competed in at Minter Field in 1955. On hand were the Golden Empire Region - Porsche Club of America with 20+ beautiful Porsches. There was a costume contest, '50s music, Deep Pit Beef BBQ dinner, and dancing. It was a wonderful evening and in 2014 the event will be even better.

**Shafter Centennial Celebration Parade (October 19th, 2013)** - The museum participated in the parade that kicked off a day of celebration. The museum's fire truck, "Follow Me" Jeep, Dave Patterson's Weasel, the 1942 Plymouth Staff Car, and the Hughes OH- 6 Helicopter pulled by a 1943 vintage Jeep led the parade.

**November Fly- in (November 2nd)** - The museum and the Minter Field Airport District hosted a fly- in complete with a \$5 pancake breakfast, Flour drop and spot landing contest. Special guests including Pearl Judd, a WASP stationed at Minter Field in 1944, and Elinor Otto, an original "Rosie The Riveter." The event was a huge success.

**Veteran's Day Parade (November 11th)** - As is tradition, the museum participated in the Veteran's Day Parade in Bakersfield. The parade length had increased over previous years, and there were more entries than ever before. It was an honor to participate.

**Museum Open House (December 14th, 2013)** - The museum had it's annual open house in December, with lots of refreshments and snacks to celebrate the holidays.

# **Collections Update**

James Whitehead. Vice Chairman of the museum, has been very busy organizing the artifact displays. If you haven't been to the museum in more than a year, you should make the effort and plan a visit. You will be surprised at the changes. Some of the more notable changes include the addition of the Viet Nam POW display. There have been additions to the World War I collection, courtesy of Scott Hogstad, whose grandfather (a local resident) served. The collection is in honor of his service. Recently Pearl Judd, a former WASP stationed at Minter Field in 1944, donated the medal that she was awarded in 2013, from the Gathering of Eagles Foundation, in recognition of her service as a WASP. Great progress has been made on the Link Trainer, one of the original mechanical airplane simulators used at Minter Field during WW II. It is now operational, but still requires a little more restoration before any more "simulations" can commence. Also on display is the original transmitter that came out of the air control tower. The transmitter was salvaged by Ron Pierce, current Chairman of the museum, and his father, who worked on the base during WW II. Another unique addition to the museum are the original glass runway landing strip light globes.

#### Library Project

Did you realize that the Minter Field Air Museum had a library? The library has quite an extensive collection of books on just about every type of subject related to 20th century and 21st century military history, people, and hardware. There is quite a collection of technical manuals, reference books, and coffee table books. In addition, the museum has a large number of periodicals and magazines specializing in airplanes, military subjects, plastic modeling, and so much more.

The library is not quite ready for public use, but plans are to have it available to the public later in 2014. Currently Daryl Curtis and Pat Marshall are cataloguing the collection and setting up a searchable database. The database will be available online as well as on the library computer.

The goal is to have a great place for researchers, military buffs, and students to broaden their education and make Minter Field Air Museum a valuable resource to the community.

#### **Cataloguing Project**

#### Landscape Project

The museum staff is excited about our upcoming landscape project. This project will revitalize the bare property that the museum sits on. The landscaping design will be provided by students from Bakersfield College. The initial project should be completed in 2014.

In related news, the Minter Field Airport District replaced the fencing around the hangar adjacent to the museum. The fence is wonderful, looks great, and provides added security for our collection.

#### Walk of Honor / Memorial Plaza

The museum, in conjunction with its landscaping project, will incorporate a "Walk of Honor" and a "Memorial Plaza," to be located near the entrance to the museum.

The "Walk of Honor" will incorporate 13" diameter discs set into the concrete walkway leading to the museum entrance.

The Memorial Plaza will be constructed of granite bricks, incorporating the existing monument and flag pole as part of the Memorial area.

Details regarding the cost for the Walk of Honor plaques and the Memorial Plaza bricks (which includes the engraving) will be in the next newsletter and on the web site under "Membership."

#### The Memorial Plaza will encompass the dirt area around the monument and the flagpole (below). The Walk of Honor will utilize the sidewalk leading to the entrance.



#### **Restoration Project: Hughes OH-6 Helicopter**

The latest project (one of many!) that the museum is engaged in is the restoration of its Hughes OH-6 Helicopter that the museum acquired several years ago from the U.S. Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA). This helicopter will be restored to its original Viet Nam era configuration, in honor of veterans that served in Viet Nam. The rotor craft was built in 1968, and served in Viet Nam. Later it saw action as part of a fleet of helicopters for the Border Patrol service, then the DEA, before ending up as a trainer for the Department of Agriculture. More details will follow in subsequent newsletters. Please come out to the museum to see this project underway. We are looking for donations or sponsors to help complete this project.
